SUMMARY: Members of committees and commissions are appointed by the Mayor, subject to approval by the City Council. Due to a vacancy on the PCR Committee following the resignation of Ryan Humphrey because he has accepted full-time employment with PCR, the Mayor has appointed Kim Hankins and the appointment is submitted for approval.

PREVIOUS COUNCIL ACTION: Council is provided the opportunity to approve the Mayor's appointments to committees and commissions annually, or as vacancies and appointments occur throughout the year.

BACKGROUND and **DISCUSSION**: Ryan Humphrey has accepted the Recreation Program Coordinator position at PCR effective October 1, 2024. It is deemed that he has resigned from the committee as PCR employees cannot concurrently serve on the committee. The Mayor appointed Mr. Kim Hankins to the PCR Committee, which appointment is supported by PCR Director Roger Blakeley.

Kim Hankins Information for PCR Board

Working with youth.

Since my early days in Law Enforcement I have worked with youth. Many of those needed attention from adults to help prepare them to be good members of the community. Helping them through community services, and through local church programs that provided activities for them proved to be a valuable asset.

I worked with my local department with outreach programs for youth which included an annual Fishing Derby, and volunteering with the Parks Department on the Easter Egg Hunt each year.

I coached baseball for a few years to help our community allow all the kids who signed up, a chance to play.

I became a and Assistant Scout Master helping the troop with many of the Merit Badge requirements for Hiking, biking, camping (including cold weather camping), shooting, woodworking, first aid, climbing and others.

I also served on the Illowa Council as a committee member for scouts to attend Jamboree. I attended Jamboree as a transport driver of equipment. Once at the Jamboree, I worked at fishing, helping scouts work towards their merit badges. These were scouts from all over the country, not just our region.

I worked with vacation bible school at church to fill in where needed and make sure the youth that attended were safe.

I learned that youth are looking for someone to help them, not just play, but learn. While teaching them sports, or survival skills they also learn how to become productive citizens who can carry on that tradition.

I also have served on many committees, from a Governor's appointment to motorcycle safety in Illinois to serving as a member of the Police and Fire Commission for my home town, I know it is important to give back.

While I have not been in the community long, I am looking for a place to help and I believe the PCR is an excellent place. Helping youth young adults and others is an opportunity to help may people.
