A few homes will be chosen for a Stantec representative to visit and collect samples.

What is a **Brownfield**?

A "brownfield" is a property that has, or may be perceived to have, environmental impacts. The potential release of hazardous substances, petroleum, or presence of regulated building materials may consequently impede reuse/redevelopment opportunities. By completing environmental site assessment and cleanup activities, brownfields have the potential to transform from liabilities into assets that will benefit the community.

What is a Regulated Building Materials Survey?

A RBM is a physical study where building material samples are collected and tested to confirm if hazardous substances are present. It will determine if asbestos, lead paint, mold, PCBs, mercury or other regulated substances are present in building materials.

Will this affect my property value?

RBM's allow property owners to quantify the amount of contamination on a property (or lack thereof). For properties with little to no contamination, this knowledge may increase marketability. For sites with significant contamination, property owners can realize increased value through cleanup, tax incentives and reduced liabilities.

Which sites are eligible?

Both publicly and privately owned properties can be eligible. Eligibility is determined on a case-by-case basis. You will be asked to provide an environmental consultant from Stantec access to your property, and you will have the right to stop participation in the program at any time.

How do I nominate a site?

Property owners are encouraged to nominate sites for grant funding by completing a Site Nomination Form.
